Post News Notes of Interest

Friday evening's **Bourbon and Cigar Night** will feature tastings of Elijah Craig small batch, Bulleit and Basil Hayden along with an Oliva cigar. Tickets are \$50 each and can be purchased at the bar. Unfortunately, at publication deadline, only eight reservations are on the books - - - although the event planners are hearing lots of "I can't commit, but I'm planning to be there." Please remember that this kind of 'wavering, middle-of-the-road commitment' really makes it difficult for event planners to prepare the evening's hors d'oeuvres.

At last count, fewer than 60 tickets have been sold to the Saturday night, Feb. 11 Valentine "Laughter at the Legion" show. Event planners understand that they have 18-24 "pending" ticket sales. Post Finance Officer Ralph Jordan said 87 tickets need to be sold to break even. Check the event list in this publication for more information and ticket purchase details.

During the first seven months of the Post's fiscal year (July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023) more than \$20,000+ has been spent on **Maintenance and Repairs to Post** facilities. Proceeds raised through the comedy show and Bourbon and Cigar night will help replenish those funds as well as be used to support veterans outreach activities.

Less than a week remains for **2023 Membership Renewals** to be completed. At publication deadline, the Post stands at an 87% of goal ranking. That's 91 renewals short of the Post's 700 members goal. Keep in mind that effective Wednesday, Feb. 1 customers at the bar who are not current with their membership will be charged public (guest) pricing and will be required to sign the guest book.

Forsyth County High School Student Wins Post's 1st Oratorical in 5 Years

Vinayak Menon of Forsyth County's Lambert High School took first place in last Saturday's oratorical competition hosted by the Post. His 10 minute presentation, "The U.S. Constitution - - The Compass to a More Perfect Union" earned him a \$1,000 scholarship check from the Post.

Phillip Kittila from Cambridge High School in Fulton County took second place and walked away with \$750, and Jackson Kennedy of the Wesleyan School earned the third place award and a \$500 check from the Post.

Thanks to Tom Billings who would not let the idea of holding the contest die. He searched out David Cunnold and convinced him to take the lead and "make the contest happen" this year. The last time the Post hosted a local oratorical contest was five years ago.

Since 1938 the American Legion Oratorical Contest has sought to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. The program has presented participants with an academic speaking challenge that teaches important leadership qualities, the history of our nation's laws, the ability to think and speak clearly, and an understanding of the duties, responsibilities, rights and privileges of American citizenship.

The overall national contest winner gets a \$25,000 scholarship. Second place takes home \$22,500, and third gets \$20,000. Each department (state) winner who is certified into and participates in the national contest's first round receives a \$2,000 scholarship. Those who advance past the first round receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship. The American Legion's scholarship awards may be used at any college or university in the U.S.

Let's wish all the best for Vinayak as he starts the climb toward this year's national competition.
