'Laughter at the Legion III' Starts Final Countdown to Saturday, Feb. 11 Show

The countdown starts today at "10" but in this case it's not a launch into space from Cape Kennedy or Vandenberg AFB - - - it's a 10-day count down to Laughter at the Legion III, a 'Valentine's Sweetheart Special' evening at the Post on Saturday night, Feb. 11.

Doors for the show will open at 6 p.m. Show time is 8 p.m. Tickets are \$40 per person, open seating. Tickets can be purchased online by [clicking here](#), or they may be purchased at the Clubroom/Bar. The evening includes special pricing on Budweiser and Bud Light beers.

Ticket sales were a little slow as of 12 noon yesterday with 70 sold and another three tables reserved. However history suggests that there will be a last minute rush since it's open seating tickets. Those interested in reserving a table for \$240 (six seats) may make those arrangements at the Clubroom/Bar during business hours, or contact Finance Officer Ralph Jordan.

Volunteers Save Post \$35K+ in Labor Costs on Baseball Concession Rehab

Thanks to a group of volunteers who have been rehabbing the baseball field concession stand since mid December, the Post has saved some \$35,000 (a conservative estimate) in construction labor costs. Materials for the project cost approximately \$4,500, although the hard numbers are still being finalized.

Their commitment to the Post means the concession stand will be open and ready for business for all King's Ridge baseball games this year. It will be staffed by King's Ridge parents.

In addition to Dave Kirchner who oversaw the project, other volunteers included "Big" Mike Carroll, Ralph Fike, Paul Sheridan, Alan Dudley, and Bob Quinn who specifically helped with painting the kitchen and operated the table saw to cut tiles for the bathroom showers.

Here's a partial list of work accomplished according to Kirchner: totally gutted the restrooms, removed all walls, wood, plumbing and electrical fixtures; used a jack hammer to remove all floor tile; hammered through slabs to access all drains below floor and replaced them with proper flanges etc.; removed the lower half of sheetrock walls in the kitchen area; and removed the vent hood system.

Also the volunteer team scraped all the ceilings to give them a smooth finish; replaced the return air duct work; securely fastened all sheetrock to the ceiling; re-framed, sheet rocked, plumbed and re-wired all areas of the building; installed a main shut off valve and pressure regulator for building; removed all unused electrical circuits; and installed cinder blocks and mortar to seal several holes in building.

According to Kirchner the walls for the bathroom stalls are rather expensive, so rather than attempting to save money and fabricate them using existing materials, the volunteers are trading out their talents to work on a private home in return for a donation to purchase manufactured bathroom stalls.

Also Kirchner noted that the Post's SAL members have donated \$750 to cover some of the material costs incurred on the project.
