American Legion Celebrates 104th Birthday Wednesday

The American Legion turns 104 on Wednesday, Mar. 15 - - the day in 1919 when the first American Legion caucus, held by members of the American Expeditionary Force (AEF), convened in Paris.

A group of 20 officers is credited with founding the Legion. AEF Headquarters asked the officers to suggest ideas on how to improve troop morale. One officer, Lieutenant Colonel Theodore Roosevelt Jr., proposed an organization of veterans.

In February 1919, the group formed a temporary committee and selected several hundred individuals who had the confidence and respect of the whole army. About 1,000 officers and enlisted men attended the Paris Caucus in March 1919. They adopted a temporary Constitution and the name The American Legion. <u>Click here to read</u> more about the history of The American Legion.

In a 104th birthday speech drafted by the national organization for members to use and tailor for local audience, the prepared text noted that "Last year, The American Legion witnessed the signing of the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our PACT Act. The law provides comprehensive health care and benefits to veterans with illnesses related to burn pits, atomic radiation, Agent Orange and other toxic exposures."

"Thousands of Legionnaires worldwide wrote, called, visited and messaged lawmakers. They reminded Congress that elected officials should serve veterans as well as veterans have served America," the advance speech text also notes. <u>Click here to read</u> the full text.

Canton Post, Homeless Vet Program Allocated \$700K To Help Address 'Homelessness' in Cherokee County

The American Legion Post in Canton, in conjunction with the Cherokee Homeless Veterans Program (CCHVP), were recently allocated \$700,000 of \$2.5 million in federal funds to address homelessness. The funds were being distributed to area non profits by the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners.

According to an article by *Cherokee Tribune* staff writer Ethan Johnson, funds allocated to Post 45 and CCHVP will be used to purchase land at 111 Faye Drive at Bells Ferry Road and renovate the existing home to provide beds for up to 16 veterans for a six-to-nine-month term. <u>Click here to read</u> the story.
