## Five Leadership Positions Contested, Two Skate Uncontested; Elections Set For Tuesday, May 16 Membership Meet

All the nominations for next year's leadership team are now in place with elections scheduled for the 7 p.m. Tuesday, May 16 general membership meeting. Two positions, the Finance officer and the Jr. Vice Commander, only have one nomination each. So Ralph Jordan is the presumptive winner of the Finance officer slot, and Tom Richardson is the presumptive winner of the Jr. Vice Commander vacancy.

However the remaining five open positions have two candidates running for each slot. They are:

Commander - Tom Billings, nominated by Fred Mahony; and Dave Kirchner, nominated by Jim Nessia. The winner of this race will serve for one-year, completing the unexpired term of the current Post Commander Fred Mahony who announced previously that he will not serve the second year of his two-year term due to personal plans which will be taking him away from the local area.

Sr. Vice Commander - Alan Dudley, nominated by Dave Kirchner; and Jeff Rahn, nominated by Ed Holben.

Judge Advocate - Bob Byrd who was self nominated; and Ralph Fike, nominated by David Kirchner.

Executive Committee Member (3 year term) – Tina Johnson, nominated by John Dowd; and Bob Moye, nominated by Alan Dudley.

When questioned about running for Judge Advocate while he has one year remaining on his three-year term as a member of the executive committee, Byrd said if he was elected Judge Advocated he would resign his executive committee position. Then that open position would be filled by next year's Leadership team who would appoint a member of the Post to fill the remaining year of Byrd's executive committee member term.

If he is not elected Judge Advocate Byrd said he would remain in his executive committee member slot for the remainder of his term.

Candidates must provide a copy of their DD-214 to the Post Adjutant to be certified as eligible by the Credentials Committee prior to the election. And members who plan to vote at next month's

election must be a Post 201 Legionnaire in good standing and paid up for Calendar Year 2023. They will also be asked to present their current membership card prior to being provided a ballot.

#### Other Meeting Activities

In other action the members approved:

- a budget of \$2,000 to support the upcoming Family Day at the Legion on Saturday, Apr. 29.
- \$150 to bring the already approved \$350 donation to the "Submarine" Mike Kotler Scholarship up to \$500. This would be the Post's contribution to fund an anticipated \$4,000 scholarship in his memory. Mike's VFW Post (which meets at Post 201) has committed \$2,000 toward the goal and the Johns Creek Veterans Association anticipates making up the difference to bring the scholarship to the \$4,000 goal. The scholarship would be presented by the Georgia Military Veterans Hall of Fame to a JROTC high school senior who plans to attend a university or college in Georgia, continue to participate in ROTC and accept a commission upon graduation.
- spending \$1,350 to complete the flooring in the Clubroom/Bar area.
- purchasing a new beer tub for the Clubroom/Bar for \$1,553.71.
- a \$2,490.73 contract with EMC Security of Suwanee for a new security system which would be installed by John Dowd at no cost. In addition, the EMC charges of \$99 sign up fee and a \$30.95 monthly monitoring fee. The monthly monitoring fee is slightly less than half the fee charged by American Alarm who currently has the Post's contract.

The 28 meeting attendees approved two transfers and four new members. Transfers are Douglas H. Swift, USAF; and Mark D'atcangelo, USN. New members are Thomas Scrimo, USMC; Johhn Kimber, USN; Adam Riggs, USCG; and Horace W. Strand, Jr., USMC. The Post's membership now stands at 96 per cent of the 700 member goal.

Bob Byrd announced plans to start a raffle game in the Clubroom/Bar sometime during the month of May. He also called attention to the Military Unit plaques hanging on the wall in the Clubroom that honor Legion member's military units.

If members would like to have their unit, or a member of their family's unit displayed, contact him. His email is <a href="mailto:bobbyrd947@gmail.com">bobbyrd947@gmail.com</a>. Plaques range in cost from \$80 for a 20" x 16" to less than \$80 for smaller sizes. As an alternative, members may want to add their distinctive unit insignia to a plaque already displayed.

Alan Dudley reported that the concession stand has grossed in the range of \$5,000 in sales during the King's Ridge baseball season.

Japan was occupied and administered by the Allies of World War II from the surrender of the Empire of Japan on Sept. 2, 1945 until the Treaty of San Francisco took effect on Apr. 28, 1952.

Unlike the occupation of Germany and Austria, the Soviet Union had little to no influence over the occupation of Japan, declining to participate because it did not want to place Soviet troops under General Douglas MacArthur's direct command.
