Billings Elected Post Commander; New Leadership Takes Helm Thursday, June 1

Tuesday evening's General Membership meeting, which was election night for next year's leadership, drew 55 Legionnaires to the Post to vote - - - the most at any general membership meeting during the past 12 months. However, as large as that turnout was it still represents only 7.7 percent of the Post's 718 total paid members. That said, the newly elected leadership will inherit the responsibility on Thursday, June 1. Next year's leadership includes:

Commander -Tom Billings.

The new commander will fill the remaining one year of departing Commander Fred Mahony's two-year term. Mahony announced previously that he will not serve the second year of his two-year term due to personal plans which will be taking him away from the local area.

Sr. Vice Commander - Alan Dudley.

Jr. Vice Commander-Tom Richardson (uncontested).

Finance Officer-Ralph Jordan (uncontested).

Judge Advocate -Bob Byrd.

With his election as Judge Advocate, Byrd will have to resign his executive committee member slot. At a future date a replacement will be selected fill the final year of his three-year term.

Executive Committee Member (3-year term)-Bob Moye.

Adjutant-To be named at a later date since this is an appointed position by the Commander.

In his campaign speech prior to the vote, the new commander said his goals for the coming year include emphasizing the American Legion's four pillars of service - - Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism and Children & Youth.

Focusing on those goals, he said, would include sending more young men to Boys State, increasing participation in the annual Oratorical Contest, and expanding the Post's scholarship and veterans educational programs.

Billings also said the Post needs to develop some community recognition programs such as awarding Law Officer and Firefighter of the Year awards, both of which would help bring the Post greater visibility in the community. He also pointed to the continuing need to develop both "financial and physical resources" for the Post.

In closing, Billings said his guiding principles as commander would be to "make informed decisions, based on fact not rumor, using sound judgement, and letting common sense rather than emotions prevail."

In other actions at the meeting, the membership approved:

- Spending up to \$20,000 to purchase and install a new, larger hood over the kitchen stove. The hood itself is expected to cost some \$6,000. The difference includes \$9,600 to install it and another \$4,000 to install a new fire suppression system that meets code enforcement standards associated with the new hood.
- Spending approximately \$1,600 to purchase a small freezer, a table-top warmer and a popcorn machine for the concession stand. Reimbursement for this expenditure is expected to come from concession stand sales during the remainder of the baseball season.
- Spending \$1,700 for tree removal service.

During the meeting the membership also:

- Heard an update on the FY 2023-2024 budget which is currently being developed. Finance officer Ralph Jordan said he expects the final budget would be presented to Post membership for approval at the July membership meeting.
- Approved membership applications for two transfers and nine new members. Transfers are: Morris R. Chappell, and Richard S. Turner, both from Post 400. New members are: Robert Pfister, USAF, Viet Nam; Jennifer Bowman, USN, Gulf; Clark Donelly, USN, Gulf; Elizabeth Griffith, USAF, Panama; Ronald Von Holt, USAF, Viet Nam; Theodore (Ted) Turner, USAF, Viet Nam; Roland T. Vann, USAF, Viet Nam; Rex Dunlap, USN; and Rob Sumter, USN, Gulf. The Post currently has 718 members, which is 103 percent of the 700 membership goal.
- Learned that the SAL has achieved 111 percent of its membership goal. SAL's goal was 216. Membership currently stand at 241, and they are pushing to reach 250.
