### Two Scholarship Checks Presented At Post General Membership Meeting

Initial July 4th Plans Outlined; FY 23-24 Special Budget Meet Set for 4 p.m., July 10

Two of the four \$1,500 Post scholarship winners collected their checks Tuesday night at the General Membership meeting. Kayleigh Kilgore of Cumming and Chandler McDade of Marietta were presented their checks in a brief ceremony at the start of the meeting by Post Commander Tom Billings.

Kilgore, a graduate of Denmark HS will attend the University of Georgia where she plans to major in biology and eventually become a physician's assistant. McDade, who graduated from Pope HS, will be attending the University of Tennessee, majoring in engineering. He also plans to join the Army ROTC, and hopes to complete Ranger training.

The other two scholarship winners were Brady Kilgore (Kayleigh's twin brother) also of Cumming, and Jack Parsons of Alpharetta.

Brady, also a Denmark HS graduate, will be attending Georgia Southern University. He could not attend the check presentation because he was at Georgia Southern hoping to qualify for the varsity fishing team. Parson's, a Blessed Trinity HS graduate will be attending Auburn University.

In addition to the scholarship checks presentation, the 22 Legion and two SAL members attending heard a series of updates on various Post activities, most of which were previously reported at the June 13 Executive Committee meeting. However some 'new' news surfaced on several matters including:

- The Executive Committee, at its Monday afternoon special meeting on the FY 23-24 budget, concluded that a follow-up special meeting is necessary to dig deeper in to the individual line items numbers that generated the 2-page summary budget proposal. That meeting is scheduled for 4 p.m. Monday, July 10.
- John Dowd announced that the Post's internet service has been repaired. The Post started experiencing spotty service on Saturday and Sunday and lost all service on Monday. According to Dowd an internet service "box" on a telephone pole at the

back of the parking lot was struck by lightning causing it to burn out over a short period of time. The box was replaced by Comcast on Tuesday and full service was restored.

- Dowd also said the new electronic security system should be in place and working by July 1. The monthly fee for the new system will be approximately half that of the current fee, so the cost of the new equipment will be amortized over a period of three and a half years.
- Baseball Committee chair Alan Dudley reported that TrackMan, a doppler radar ball flight tracking system will soon be installed at the Post's baseball field. The tracking begins when the ball is released from the pitcher's hand and ends shortly after the ball leaves the bat or is caught by the catcher. It measures full ball trajectory and spin, including metrics such as vertical release angle and horizontal movement. TrackMan is used by all 30 Major League Baseball teams, top amateur organizations, prominent collegiate summer leagues and is embedded in more than 500 stadiums around the world.
- Dudley also said that "thanks to Paul Sheridan's initiative" the National Anthem in now played before every game at the Post.
- Entertainment chair David Kirchner reported that planning is underway for July 4 activities at the Post. He said the Clubroom/Bar will be open at 11 a.m. The concession stand opens at 12 noon. Children's activities will include bounce houses. And the Alpharetta City Band scheduled to play a late afternoon concert. John Dowd will oversee parking that day as numerous guests use the Post's parking facilities and grounds to view the Alpharetta's fireworks. Those interested in helping with parking should get in touch with Dowd.
- During an update discussion on the Scholarship program by Billings, he noted he was still looking for someone to chair the committee. Roger Wise heard the call and volunteered for the job, which Billings immediately assigned to him.
- Taking advantage of the "Good of the Legion" portion of the meeting, Jr. Vice Commander Tom Richards conducted a brief focus group of those attending. He asked: "What will get you to come to the Post? What are we doing right? What do we need to do? A variety of responses were offered including the need to focus on programming that would attract younger veterans, especially those who have spouses and children.
- While no 'silver bullet' surfaced during the brief 'focus group', the idea of asking for improvement suggestions via this e-newsletter surfaced. Just prior to the meeting's 8 p.m. close, Billings recognized and passed the microphone to Immediate Past Commander Fred Mahony for some comments.

"I had a great two years as commander," he said. However, he also said some things didn't happen 'on his watch' due to lack of advance planning. The lesson learned, he said, is that "committees need to plan in advance when you want to get something done."
