Upwards of 1,000 Visit Post For Independence Day Activities

The music of the Alpharetta City Band, punctuated by the screams of delight as children play on the bounce houses on the Post grounds, and the smells of hot dogs and hamburgers being cooked on the grill at the baseball field concession stand welcomed the early-evening arrivals who had decided that the Post was the best place to see the City's July 4 fireworks.

After getting off to a slow midday start, even though children and their parents started showing up at 12 noon, by the 6 p.m. band concert time crowd estimates stood at 400-500 people on the grounds and another 30 or so in the Clubroom/Bar.

A hard count of automobiles parked on the grounds at 6:30 p.m. registered 190. Between then and 9:30 p.m. fireworks time, parking spaces on the lot and grass field behind the Post reached max capacity and nearby neighbors could be seen walking onto the grounds - - - swelling the crowd to nearly 1,000.

But perhaps the surprise of the evening for many was watching Post Commander Tom Billings take the conductor's baton from band leader Dr. Nicole Fallin. He's not a neophyte in the music world having played with the Atlanta Concert Band during his younger days as well as playing the club and party circuit with a small dance band. So he stepped on the podium displaying the confidence of a maestro to lead the 40-plus musicians in the final piece for the evening - - - the traditional and much-loved John Philip Sousa march, *Stars and Stripes Forever*.

By all accounts July 4th at the Post was a clear success - - - thanks in large measure to Event Committee Chair David Kirchner and all the volunteers who helped make it happen.

John Dowd and his car-parking team raised \$3,028.72 in donations. The odd "cents" in the final number can be attributed to the cost of fees associated with credit card processing. However, at the start of the day Dowd said his parking donation goal was \$3,000. He met the mark!

Food sales at the concession stand totaled \$1,696.00, It would probably have been slightly more except for the fact that Alan Dudley and his team sold all the hot dogs and hamburgers they had in stock nearly an hour before the start of the fireworks.

Bar sales for the day were \$1,690.00 - - - four-to-five times the normal Tuesday sales at the Post. But the sales, which were exactly \$6 less than the concession stand sales, proved to be something of a 'head scratcher' when Finance Assistant DiAne Casale ran the numbers yesterday morning. But after multiple rechecks, the sales number was accurate.

While there may be another invoice or two that hasn't surfaced yet, it's safe to report that the Post cleared more than \$4,800 to support veterans' activities.
