#### Old Soldiers Day Activities at Post Kick Off with 1st Saturday Breakfast, Formal Ceremony Set for 12 noon

This year's Old Soldiers Day (OSD) will get off to a strong start with the monthly First Saturday Pot Luck Breakfast. Designed as an opportunity for members of the Post family and first responders to gather in an informal setting, folks will start gathering in the 8 a.m. time frame. Generally meal service follows within 30-45 minutes later. But it's a laid-back affair with no formal schedule.

For those who hang around long enough after the breakfast, the Clubroom/Bar will open at 11 a.m. And a well known local area band, N2U, will start entertaining those arriving early for the 12 noon Old Soldiers Day ceremony, as well as others in the area.

N2U is a four-piece combo whose members have done studio work in Nashville. They have also played USO tours for servicemen and women in far-flung location, and locally at American Legion posts in Marietta and Jonesboro, as well as other clubs and civic organizations. The band will be bringing country, Southern Rock, R&B, Blues, 50's Oldies, 60's 70's, 80's and 90's sounds to the Post along with an occasional touch of a jazz.

Participants at the midday OSD ceremony include State Senator John Albers, State Representative Chuck Martin, Alpharetta Mayor Jim Galvin, Post 201 Ambassador Roger Wise and Commander Tom Billings. The master of ceremonies will be Scott Childress.

The Greater Atlanta Area 9th and 10th (Horse) Cavalry Association Buffalo Soldiers from Decatur and the Johns Creek Veterans Association color guard will also participate. Former city councilman John Monson will sing the National Anthem. And David Mitchell, a chaplain and member of the Roswell Masonic Lodge, will deliver the invocation.

Following the ceremony, N2U will fire up their "sound" again until 2 p.m. and lunch will be available for all attendees.

I would like to include thoughts from children of the other military branches as I believe someone who had a career military father in the Marines or Navy or Coast Guard who was absent for months at a time had a very different experience than mine.
