JCVA Launches New Final Stages of Life Help for Vets

The Johns Creek Veterans Association (JCVA) has formed a new outreach service for veterans, the 11th Hour Squadron, to serve as an extension of a veteran's family during the final stages of life.

Volunteers will provide assistance at the pleasure of the family and work as an extension of the family, not the medical team, to be present with the veteran when family members cannot be present, or may be getting some much-needed rest for themselves.

The new service grew out of last year's death of Post 201 and JCVA member "Submarine Mike" Kotler. He died alone, at midnight, in a local rehabilitation center.

JCVA president Mike Mizell, who is also a Post 201 member, noted that "in the quiet of the night memories are shared that only another veteran can understand. In Mike's honor we will do our best to ensure no one is left alone."

11th Hour Squadron volunteers primarily serve between 9 p.m. and 9 a.m. during the final week of life. Services are available for patients in hospitals, hospice centers, assisted living facilities and rehabilitation centers within a 20-mile radius of Johns Creek. They do not serve in private homes. Priority is given to members of the JCVA and VetBuds.
