Executive Committee member - - a one-year term (filling the final year of an unexpired term where the existing member has resigned).

Nominations may be made between now and the April General Membership meeting. You may self-nominate, or nominate someone else. If you do nominate someone else, please check with that person to make sure they are interested in running for that leadership position. Nomination may only be made by Legion members whose dues are paid for 2024.

Nominations will be officially closed at the conclusion of the April General Membership meeting.

Elections will take place at the May General Membership meeting. If you plan to vote during the May meeting, you must have a present a valid 2024 membership card for Post 201 or a Paid Up for Life membership card for Post 201.

The leadership elected at the May meeting will assume the responsibility for leading the Post on June 1, 2024.
