Post's Weekend Activity Calendar Sees Bourbon & Cigar Night, Gold Standard Band, Kentucky Derby, Cinco de Mayo with Pot Luck Meal

It's going to be a really busy at the Post this weekend. Tomorrow night at the ballroom end of the Post, the Gold Standard Band, an eight-member party band composed of Atlanta-area musicians, will take the stage at 8:30 p.m. for a three-hour show of Motown, Carolina Beach and Classic Soul sounds.

Free dance lessons are offered for a hour prior to Gold Standard taking the stage. The price is only \$12 per person for those wanting to take advantage of one of the larger dance floors in the state.

Bourbon and Cigar Night will be underway on the deck at the Clubroom/Bar end of the Post starting at 7 p.m. The three bourbons on the tasting list will be Woodford Reserve, Eagle Rare and Buffalo Trace. Cigars will come from the Forged Cigar Company.

Established in 2020 by the Scandinavian Tobacco Group (STG), Forged was created to offer premium cigars to brick and mortar cigar shops and their customers. Their ever-expanding portfolio includes well-known cigar brands such as Chillin' Moose, Diesel, FLVR as well as non-Cuban versions of Bolivar Cofradia, La Gloria Cubana and Partagas.

Don't forget about the outstanding hors d'oeuvres that are also part of the Bourbon and Cigar package. It's not too late to get a ticket. They are \$50 each and can be purchased at the bar or online by <u>clicking here</u>.

The 150th Running of the Kentucky Derby will certainly be on one or more television screens in the Clubroom/Bar on Saturday afternoon. Twenty horses are set to compete in the race that's happened annually – and without interruption – since 1875. The official post time for the main event is 6:57 p.m. EDT.

Traditionally the Post has offered some special "Derby Drinks" on Derby Day. However, at publication deadline nothing has been announced for this year. But surely something special should be on a Derby Day Drink menu this Saturday.

The weekend will draw to a close Sunday with Cinco de Mayo. Members of the Post 201 family are being asked to bring a pot-luck Mexican food dish to share. Click here to see the event flyer.
