# 235 New Ballroom Chairs Set to Arrive at Post Today

Starting midday today, 235 brand new chairs will begin arriving at the Post ballroom - - - thanks in large measure to members of the Post's 'dance community' who reportedly raised more than 90 per cent of the \$5,640 total price tag for the chairs.

Each chair, which cost \$22.79, is slightly wider and taller than the chairs currently in the ballroom. They also have 2.5 inches of black vinyl padding on the seat along with the same type of vinyl padding on the chair back.

When combined with 65 of the best of the Post's original chairs, the Post can now provide much more "comfortable seating" for up to 300 people attending events in the ballroom. Or if not needed in the ballroom, they may start turning up in the Clubroom.

The single largest donation for the chairs was \$200. No records were kept, however, to track how many individual donations were made to the chair fund or whether each donor was a member of the Post 201 Family or not. However estimates suggest that about 40 per cent of those who frequently dance at the Post are members of the greater Post 201 Family.

Getting the new chairs to the Post from BizChair of Canton is only half the job. Lots of real heavy lifting was needed to make room for the new chairs prior to their delivery.

Dave Gordon, event/entertainment committee chair, said "a massive effort was required to organize and clean the storage room" prior to delivery. Also, he said the Clubroom/Bar wooden chairs which were stored in the Bingo storage area were removed and inspected. Those bar stool chairs which can be repaired will be done by Julian Glantz who is a member of the Post as well as the dance community.

In addition to Glantz, here's David's "shout out and thank you" list of volunteers who helped prepare the storage space for the new chairs during the past three days:

• Thomas Williams, Mark Williams, and Elizabeth Williams, Dave Gordon, and Ralph Fike for the herculean effort to sort through the myriad of boxes, bins and identify 65 of the best original chairs to keep.

- Julian Glantz for moving more than 120 of the original chairs out of the facility for pickup last night; and for identifying and agreeing to repair the Clubroom chairs.
- Tom Moore, a dancer, for using his vehicle with trailer to dispose of the original chairs.
- And Glantz and Gordon for helping the Finance office organize and separate
  outdated boxes containing material that has been slated for shredding which they
  were cleaning and making space in the store room for the new chairs.
