Leadership Elections Top Tuesday Membership Meet

The election of the Post's commander for the next two years, which is the only contested leadership position, will highlight Tuesday's General Membership meeting. The meeting will start at 7 p.m.

Bob Byrd and David Kirchner are the two nominees for the commander's slot. The six other open positions on the executive committee are uncontested.

Voting Tuesday night will be the final item on the agenda said Post Commander Tom Billings. During the vote casting and counting period, the membership will take a break from the meeting, he added.

Members who plan to vote must have in their possession and present a valid 2024 Post 201 membership card, or a Paid Up for Life membership card which reflects your Post 201 membership.

No 2024 membership renewal payments will be accepted on the day of the General Membership meeting.

When the votes are counted by the nominations/elections committee (Fred Mahony - chair, Denise Fisher and Shaheed Ahmedi) the winner and the total votes for each candidate will be announced.

Those elected to office Tuesday evening will assume leadership responsibility effective Saturday, June 1, 2024.

The uncontested 24-25 leadership positions are:

Sr. Vice Commander - - a one-year term. Tom Richardson.

Jr. Vice Commander - - a one-year term. Ralph Fike.

Finance Officer - - a one-year term. Ralph Jordan.

Judge Advocate - - a one-year term. Jim Davis.

Executive Committee member - - a three-year term. Penny Kumpf.

Executive Committee member - - a one-year term to fill the final year of an unexpired term for a member who resigned. Harry Hollingsworth.

Bob Moye, who was elected to a three-year term on the Executive Committee last year, will roll forward to his second year.

Current Post Commander Tom Billings will take over the immediate past commander slot on next year's Executive Committee, replacing Fred Mahony who will be stepping down.
