72nd Annual Old Soldiers Day To Honor Women Who Served

This Saturday the Post will celebrate its 72nd Annual Old Soldiers Day (OSD) honoring this year "All Women Who Have Served." Post members Denise Fisher, U.S. Army (Ret.) and Penny Kumpf, U.S. Navy Veteran, are co-chairs for this year's OSD activities.

The Post will be open to the public all day. Official activities begin at 10 a.m. with a 20-25 minute ceremony on the Walk of Memory grounds. It will be followed by a reception in the ballroom for all the women vets (and active duty/reserve members) who attend the event.

The program's guest speaker will be Martina Schmidt, U.S. Air Force (Ret.), Chairwoman of the "She Served Initiative." The Alpharetta City Band Brass Ensemble will provide music before and after the program. Scouts from Troop 51 will present the colors, and a memorial brick "Honoring All Women Who Served" will be added to the Walk of Memories.

For the remainder of the day all women veterans and those who are on active duty or the active reserve will be able to purchase any wine or liquor the bar serves for \$1 less than the published price for that particular beverage.

Big Band Show and Dance

The day will conclude with a two-hour "Big Band" show and dance in the ballroom starting at 8 p.m. Music will be provided by the 22-member Alpha Jazz. Formed in 2018 under the Alpharetta City Band umbrella, this ensemble brings a distinctly different genre of music to the Alpharetta scene.

Composed of trumpets, trombones, saxophones, a rhythm section and vocalists, this extremely talented group of musicians excels in the improvisational nature of jazz. Others may choose to put it into the "Big Band Sound" category.

Here's a list of Big Band 'sounds' on the Alpha Jazz playlist - - - many of which the audience can expect to hear and dance to Saturday evening: Ain't That A Kick in the Head, Jumpin' At the Woodside, Luck Be A Lady, Mambo Italiano, One O'Clock Jump, Pennsylvania 6-5000, Sing-Sing-Sing, Stardust, At the Woodchoppers Ball, Chega De Saudade (No More Blues), April in Paris, In the Mood, Jump, Jive and Wail, Moon River, Moonlight Serenade, String of Pearls, Take the A Train, The Girl from Ipanema, All of Me, Fly Me To the Moon and The Way You Look Tonight.

So don't miss the evening - - - and if dancing is what's you'd like to do rather than just sitting 'n sipping a good libation while listening to memorable music, grab your dancing shoes, bring your partner, and dance the evening away.

Alpharetta City Band

The Alpharetta City Band is a traditional concert band performing under the baton of Dr. Nicole Fallin. In addition to being dedicated amateur musicians from Alpharetta and surrounding communities, all of the band members are volunteers.

The band, and its sub units which include the Alpha Jazz, the Alpha Brass, and a Dixieland group, has entertained audiences throughout the north metro area since its first concert in 1989. The band's diverse repertoire includes patriotic marches, Broadway classics, jazz standards, traditional concert band arrangements, and holiday favorites.

Dr. Fallin, joined the band in 2017. A veteran of the U.S. Army, she performed in the 3rd Infantry Division Band in Wurzburg, Germany, the 9th Infantry Division Band in Fairbanks, Alaska, and was First Sergeant and Enlisted Band Leader of the Fort Gordon Army Band in Augusta. At the Armed Forces School of Music in Norfolk, she was a trumpet instructor and brass branch supervisor.

She earned a Bachelor of Music degree from Appalachian State University, a Master of Music degree from Norfolk State University, and a Doctorate of Education degree from the University of Georgia.

Following her military service, she taught band at Augusta's Glenn Hills Middle School and John M. Tutt Middle School. She also initiated the marching band program while serving as band director at Cross Creek High School. Her teaching extended to the college level as Assistant Professor of Music at Augusta State University.
