As Veteran Population Ages; Is It Time To Think About Future Implications?

During the last 80 years, America's involvement in wars and conflicts around the world has left a lasting legacy on the size and composition of the veteran population.

As Veterans Day 2024 approaches, but before the rush of the weekend's activities scheduled at the Post prior to Monday, Nov. 11 takes place, perhaps it's time to take a moment or two reflecting on the aging veteran population in the U.S. and thinking about the implications of what that may portend for organizations such as the American Legion in general and especially for larger posts like Post 201.

Here are some highlights from a U.S. Census document prepared in July 2023 titled *Aging Veterans: America's Veteran Population in Later Life*, which examines characteristics of the nation's 8.1 million veterans ages 65 or older in 2021.

- Nearly one-half (49%) of all veterans in the United States were 65 years or older.

- The largest group of older veterans (5.5 million) served during the Vietnam era. World War II veterans made up the smallest group (183,000) of war-time veterans.
- Older veterans were less likely to be living in poverty and had higher incomes than other older adults.
- Older veterans were more likely to have a functional disability than other older adults. However, older veterans were less likely to have a service-connected disability compared with all veterans.
- Older veterans were less likely to be at risk of isolation than other older adults. About 43% of older veterans experienced at least one characteristic of isolation compared with 46% of older adults who never served.
- In contrast, veterans in general, regardless of age, were more likely to have at least one characteristic of isolation than nonveterans (34% compared with 27%, respectively).
- Owing to women's restricted opportunities to serve in the military before the 1980s, older veterans are almost entirely men.

Older veterans are an important and valuable link to America's past conflicts. They contribute to the nation's collective memory of wartime experiences - - - one that will pass into history as the current generation of veterans ages and dies.
