Roswell Rotary to Honor Vets With 1-Day Trip to D.C., April 9

The Roswell Rotary Club has announced that their 11th Honor Air, day-long trip to Washington, D.C. to honor veterans, is scheduled for Wednesday, Apr. 9. This year's trip anticipates honoring 80 veterans from World War II, Korea and Vietnam. Post members learned about the trip during the Roswell Rotary Club hosted dinner for members this past Friday evening.

Plans call for departing Roswell at 6 a.m. and traveling to Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport for the day-long, round-trip flight to the nation's capital and back on a chartered aircraft.

While in Washington, veterans will visit the World War II, Korea, Vietnam and Lincoln memorials. The day will conclude at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery to see the Changing of the Guard ceremony. During their Washington visit the group will be escorted by the National Park Police.

There is no cost to veterans who make the trip. Guardians who travel with individual veterans are expected to cover their expenses which are \$45 per person.

The Roswell Rotary Club is also seeking contributions to support the program. For a contribution of \$911 an individuals can honor a veteran. The contribution reserves a space for a veteran to make the trip and also offers the individual making the contribution the option of travelling as a guardian.

Innovation Academy Freshman Wins Post Oratorical Contest

Viraj Das, a 15-year freshman from Innovation Academy bested three other high school juniors and two seniors as he took winning honors in this year's Post Oratorical Contest which was held on Tuesday night, Jan. 21.

His winning presentation, "The Constitution's Enduring Relevance" earned him twice as much as he expected since his \$1,000 first place prize was doubled by a matching \$1,000 contribution from the Post's SAL squadron.

The second and third place finishers of the six competing students, which included two other Innovation Academy students and one each from Chattahoochee High School, Milton High School, and Lassiter High School, also doubled their winnings of \$750 (second place) and \$500 (third place) thanks to similar matching contributions, also from the SAL.

Advait (Adi) Singh, 18, a senior at Chattahoochee took the second place award with his presentation, "Taxes: We Love to Hate Them, but We Still Need Them." The third place slot went to another Innovation Academy student, 17-year-old Junior Siddarth Suresh, whose presentation was titled "Obedience to the Rule of Law: The Foundation of our Constitutional Republic."

As the winner of the Post's competition, Das will compete in the District 9 competition scheduled for 10 a.m. Saturday, Mar. 1 at Post 7, [2343 Riverside Drive, Gainesville](https://www.google.com/maps/place/2343+Riverside+Drive,+Gainesville,+GA+30501/@34.0548,-84.3845,17z). The other levels of competition in the Post 201 chain include the Area 3 competition (Districts 9,10, and 11) which is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Sunday, Mar. 9, at Post 56, 309 Lee Street, Jefferson.; and the state finals which are scheduled for 2 p.m. Sunday, Mar. 30 at the Historic Mary Persons Auditorium, [27 Brooklyn Ave.](https://www.google.com/maps/place/27+Brooklyn+Ave.,+Forsyth,+GA+30050/@34.0548,-84.3845,17z) in Forsyth, Ga.

These competitions lead to the American Legion's national competition at Hillsdale College, Hillsdale, Mich. on May 16 – 18. Additional scholarship money is earned at each succeeding level of competition with the winner at the national level earning more than \$25,000.
