Post Leadership Elections Set for Tuesday Night Meet

Tuesday night's General Membership Meeting will settle the only unanswered question regarding the Post's 25-26 leadership team composition. Either Jeff Davis or James Timcoe will be elected Jr. Vice Commander during the meeting which starts at 7 p.m. A complimentary evening meal will be served to all attending starting in the 6 p.m. time frame. The dinner menu was not available a publication deadline.

Legion members who plan to vote must present to the election committee a 2025 membership card for Post 201. If you do not have a current membership card you will not be given a ballot to vote.

Both candidates for the Jr. Vice position have crafted not-to-exceed 500 word articles about their qualifications for the position. Those articles follow. Also, both will have the opportunity to present a five-minute campaign speech prior to the vote next Tuesday evening.

At this past Tuesday night's Executive Committee meeting Post Commander Bob Byrd flipped a coin to determine which individual's article would appear first in this newsletter and would also deliver his campaign speech first at the General Membership Meeting. Jeff Davis won the toss.

The Post's new leadership will begin their terms on June 1. Currently Post Commander Bob Byrd has one remaining year to serve as Post Commander having been elected to a two year term last year. Tom Billings will continue to serve as immediate past commander. Bob Moye has one year remaining on his 3-year term as a member of the executive committee, and Penny Kumpf has two years remaining on her term.

All other open positions on the leadership team are uncontested. They are: Sr. Vice Commander -Tom Richardson; Finance Officer - Ralph Jordan; Judge Advocate - Jim Davis; and 3-Year Executive Committee Member-Harry Hollingsworth who is also the Post Adjutant.

FY 25-26 Post Budget Discussions - A special meeting of the Post's Executive Committee is scheduled for 5 p.m. Tuesday, May 27 to conduct a detailed review of the proposed FY 25-26 annual budget for the Post. The meeting's goal is to finalize the budget and resolve any outstanding questions so the budget can be presented for approval at the Tuesday, June 17 General Membership Meeting.
