# Post's \$600,000+ Budget For Next Year Approved

With only 24 members voting at Tuesday night's General Membership meeting, the Post's proposed FY 25-26 budget was unanimously approved, but not without some friction.

Questions were raised about how the numbers were presented on the budget document itself, what information was believed to be missing from the document, and the lack of specific dollar amounts expended in prior years on individual line items which would justify or support the projected income or expense line item in the proposed budget.

However, in the absence of Post Finance Officer Ralph Jordan, other members of the Executive Committee were able to provide satisfactory explanations. They also noted that the Post's existing accounting structure was developed more than two decades ago. Modifying that structure to permit more in depth revenue/expense reporting which is generated through Post's multiple sources of income (bar, dance, hall rental, baseball, etc.) is an ongoing activity. It has received significant

attention during the past year and is still being modified in conjunction with guidance from the Post's newly retained accounting firm.

The approved budget assumes that the Post's total income for the year will be \$669,000.00. Cost of goods sold during the year are projected to be \$322,250.00. This line item primarily includes liquor, mixers, food for concessions, DJ's and band expenses, and staff salaries.

Other expenses, which include taxes, casual labor, insurance, Post and baseball utilities, community outreach activities, scholarships, general office and cleanup supplies, equipment rentals, Post baseball field and yard maintenance, general repairs and maintenance, and repayment of the SBA (Covid time frame loan to keep the Post open), and licenses and fees to conduct business are estimated to be \$331,400.00.

Members attending the meeting were also reminded that the Post's accounting documents are available for review upon making an appointment with the Finance Officer. Also, they are welcome to attend the Post's monthly Finance Committee meetings which are announced in the Post's weekly e-newsletter.

#### Other Meeting Activities

In other activity, the membership approved seven requests to join the Post. Six are new members and one is a transfer. The new members are: Brian Will, USAF, Other Conflicts; Marc Noviello, USMC, Vietnam; Margaret Dyer, USAF, Other Conflicts; Scott Brown, USMC, Gulf War; Michael Herger, USN, Gulf War; and Michael Brand, USA, Gulf War. William Sittard, a U.S. Army Vietnam vet is transferring his membership from Post 426 in Boston, Mass. to Post 201.

Post service officer Tina Johnson distributed and updated PACT Act FAQ document produced by the VA to those attending. A copy of that document is available by **clicking here**.

The SAL announced that they were 20 members short of reaching their 2025 membership goal. Currently the SAL has 270 members, SAL Commander Derek Garmon said. He also reminded members that the SAL will be selling food Saturday evening and orders can be placed via a signup sheet in the Clubroom. Garmon also announced that the 8th Annual Rick Gimpel Memorial Golf Tournament is scheduled for Wednesday, Oct. 15 at the Golf Club at Bradshaw Farm, 3030 Bradshaw Drive, Woodstock. A flyer about the tournament is posted on the Clubroom bulletin board.

Blessed Trinity Catholic High School student John Carino, one of six students the Post supported at this year's Boy's State program in Valdosta, provided members a brief recap of his week at the program. He called it a "great experience," said he didn't get enough sleep during the week as scheduled activities kept the participants really busy, and that in the mock Georgia government experience he was elected to be a Supreme Court Justice.

Other boys attending this year's Boys State program included Daniel Dri, West Forsyth HS; Raunak Gupta, Johns Creek HS; Edwin Tang, Northview HS; Lijun Xu, Mt Pisgah Christian School; and Michael Herger, also from Blessed Trinity, was elected Lieutenant Governor.

At Tuesday's General Membership meeting three young women, all graduating high school seniors, were presented \$1,500 scholarship checks from the Post to help with their continuing education. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic standing which includes accumulated grade point average, class ranking, participation in school and community activities, and writing a 300-500 word essay on the subject of "Patriotism and Citizenship – What America Means to Me".
