### Auxiliary Hosts Purple Heart Recognition, 6 p.m. Today Along Walk of Memories

Today is National Purple Heart Day - - - a day observed annually on August 7 to honor and remember the brave men and women who have been wounded or killed in action while serving in the U.S. military.

Auxiliary Unit 201 will hold a 12-15 minute ceremony at 6 p.m. tonight at the Purple Heart Memorial plaza on the Walk of Memories to honor those Vets who have been awarded the Purple Heart. Ellen Terrell-Youngblood, president of the Auxiliary, will preside.

Light refreshments will be served in the Clubroom following the ceremony. All drinks at the bar will be reduced by \$1 for veterans who have been awarded the Purple Heart.

#### A Primer on the Purple Heart

A service member can receive a Purple Heart if they are wounded, killed, or die after being wounded, while serving in the U.S. Armed Services under specific circumstances on or after April 5, 1917. These circumstances include actions against an enemy, actions with an opposing foreign force, serving with friendly foreign forces against an opposing force, or as a result of acts by such forces.

It can also be awarded for injuries sustained after March 28, 1973, from international terrorist attacks or military operations as part of a peacekeeping force. Injuries from friendly fire during armed conflict on or after December 7, 1941, may also qualify, unless caused by the member's misconduct.

On or after September 11, 2001, being killed or wounded by a foreign terrorist organization due to one's status as a

service member can also result in a Purple Heart, unless due to misconduct.

The wound must require treatment by a medical officer and be documented. Examples of qualifying injuries include those from enemy projectiles, mines, chemical/biological/nuclear agents, vehicle/aircraft accidents from enemy fire, and concussion injuries from enemy explosions. Mild traumatic brain injuries or concussions causing loss of consciousness or significant duty restriction can also qualify. However, injuries from training, non-combat situations, a member's negligence or willful misconduct, battle fatigue, or diseases not directly caused by enemy agents typically do not qualify.

#### Old Soldiers Day Sees Small, But Appreciative Turn-Out

The weather didn't look that good on Old Soldiers Day, Saturday, Aug. 2. But the rain held off for the 30-minute morning ceremony recognizing the importance of the day and the laying of a memorial brick along the Walk of Memories honoring World War II vet, Major Paul L. Lowry (Sept. 7, 1916 - Oct. 29, 1994). Click Here.

The brass ensemble's music added an element of elegance and style to the morning ceremony which only comes with live music. The four veterans affairs experts stayed relatively busy during the early afternoon providing thoughtful and responsive answers to vets who were seeking advice or counsel on various personal concerns. Martin's thoughtful comments on the reason for the day testified to his deep understanding and appreciation for the role members of the armed forces have played in the nation's history. And Childress' brief quiz on the background story associated with the words of the Star Spangled Banner enlightened many in the audience.

# VA Terminates Union Contracts For Most Bargaining Unit Employees

**Washington** — The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs announced yesterday the termination of collective bargaining agreements for most VA bargaining-unit employees, a move that will make it easier for VA leaders to promote high-performing employees, hold poor performers accountable, and improve benefits and services to America's Veterans.

"The move will ensure VA stays focused on Veterans instead of spending millions of taxpayer dollars and approximately 750,000 hours per year on union activities," the VA news release said.

"Too often, unions that represent VA employees fight against the best interests of Veterans while protecting and rewarding bad workers," said VA Secretary Doug Collins. "We're making sure VA resources and employees are singularly focused on the job we were sent here to do: providing top-notch care and service to those who wore the uniform."
