## Catered Meal Planned For Membership Meet

Catered Halfway Tree, an Alpharetta-based business, Tuesday's dinner menu will feature baked chicken, rice, peas, and vinegar red coleslaw. Complimentary meal service will begin in the 6 p.m. time frame followed the membership meeting at 7 p.m.

Tuesday night's meeting will also be the Post's last general membership meeting for calendar 2025 as the Post traditionally does not have a December membership meeting.

Halfway Tree will also be preparing 'bar food' for sale in the Clubroom this Saturday from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. So if you want to "try them out" prior to Tuesday night, be sure to swing by the Clubroom on Saturday.

#### SAL Dinner Cancelled

While on the subject of food, the previously announced SAL-hosted dinner for the membership on Sunday afternoon, Nov. 23, has been cancelled. When the date was initially selected by the SAL, they failed to take into account that the Auxiliary's twice-a-month BINGO game was also taking place the same afternoon. Currently two reschedule dates have been offered for the SAL to consider. They are Sunday Dec. 21 and Sunday Dec. 28.

#### Only One BINGO Sunday During December

The Dec. 28 date, which would normally be set aside for BINGO, is available for the SAL's consideration because Auxiliary President Ellen Terrell told the Post's Executive Committer this past Tuesday, that the Auxiliary was

planning to schedule only one game during December - - - and that will be on Sunday, Dec. 14 at 2 p.m., the second Sunday of the month

#### Cruz-In Highlights

The Nov. 8 Cruz-In hosted more than 70 vehicles during the day. An actual count was hard to establish as individual owners arrived and departed based on their personal schedules. General attendance during the day was estimated to be between 250 and 300 people. The end-of-the-day raffle generated nearly \$2,500.

According to Cruz-In chair Tommy Youngblood, more than 60 volunteers came together to "make the day" happen. He believes that Cruz-In is now the largest single event that pulls Post volunteers together to host a single event since the annual Old Soldiers Day Parade no longer occurs.

In addition to the event itself, the Post collected an SUV full of non-perishable food to support Canton's American Legion Post 45's food pantry. Auxiliary member Karen Hicks transported to the food to Canton.

#### **Executive Committee Meeting Highlights**

Also at Tuesday night's meeting, the Executive Committee approved a donation of \$550 to Wreaths of America to support the local Patriots of Liberty Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The Chapter will place wreaths on veteran's graves at 10 local cemeteries on Saturday, Dec. 13. The donation also includes three wreaths for placement around the Post.

Approved a proposal to make hiring offers to two additional bartenders and a part-time custodian.

Approved a proposal to implement a 4 per cent surcharge on all credit card transactions made at the Post starting Jan. 1, 2026. This will help offset an average monthly credit card processing fee of \$1,200 to \$1,300 which the Post has been absorbing.

The committee was also reminded that the admission fee for dances will be increased from \$12 per person to \$15 per person effective Jan. 1, 2026.

A renewed emphasis is being placed on establishing a functioning House committee to focus on building and grounds maintenance matters. Executive Committee member Penny Kumpf will lead the effort and act as the interim House Committee chair. She is currently developing a list of members interested in volunteering to help. Approved a donation of \$1,000 from a designated donations fund the Post maintains to help a female veteran member of Woodstock Post 316 who has significant breathing issues, is on oxygen and has a medically identified need for a new HVAC system in her home. The initial request for help came to the Post from District 9 leadership.
