### **15 Veterans Groups Oppose Proposed State Legislation Which Purports to Help Vets**

*Editor's Note: This publication appreciates the "heads up" about this issue from a VFW member whose Post meets at Post 201, and who is also a member of Post 201.*

Veterans representing 15 organizations, including the American Legion's Department of Georgia, gathered at the Georgia State Capitol on Wednesday, Jan. 21, to signal their opposition to House Bill 108, titled "Safeguarding American Veteran Empowerment (SAVE) Act. The bill aims to regulate for-profit, unaccredited consultants assisting veterans with disability claims, setting requirements for fee structures and disclosure of non-affiliation with the VA.

"Under current law, these claims consultants can operate in the State of Georgia and essentially scam veterans," said Rep. Josh Bonner, R-Fayetteville, a bill sponsor. "What we're trying to do is to prevent that," he added. [Click here to see the bill's sponsors and to read the legislation itself.](#)

However the 15 veterans organization, whose letterhead identifies the coalition as Georgia Veterans on the Hill, said in a Nov. 4, 2025 letter addressed to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and the members of the Georgia General Assembly that although the bill's intent is commendable, "the measure must include enforceable provisions to effectively deter predatory practices and ensure compliance with existing federal law.

The letter also said: "If House Bill 108 passes in its current form, both veterans and the State of Georgia could face significant risks. [Click here to read the entire Nov. 4 letter.](#)

Georgia boasts a significant military presence, consistently ranking as one of the top states in the nation for its veteran population. As of late 2024 and early 2025, estimates indicate there are approximately 600,000 to nearly 700,000 veterans residing in Georgia.

The state Department of Veterans Service notes that the broader military and veteran community, including family members, comprises over 1.4 million individuals. Within this population, Georgia hosts a robust community of military retirees. According to Department of Defense data from late 2022, more than 102,500 retired veterans live in Georgia

In addition to the American Legion's Department of Georgia, others in the coalition include the VFW's Department of Georgia; the VFW Auxiliary Department of Georgia; VETATLANTA; the Disabled American Veterans Department of Georgia; The Warrior Alliance; AMVETS Department of Georgia; Georgia Veterans Network; Military Order of the Purple Heart Department of Georgia; Georgia Veterans Day Association; Student Veterans of American; Georgia Military Women; HERO Agriculture; ATLVets; and the Cherokee County Homeless Veterans Program.
